I never tasted so many samples of the wedding cake she made for your cousin's wedding. Every week she would come over with another sample of the test cake. We traveled to every candy store that sold nuts, trying to find a reasonable price for the nuts that she wanted to bake in the cake. They were very expensive per pound. I remember helping her put the cake, I think in the van. It was a big, big cake. I think the cake was decorated with small bridesmaid figures that wore gowns that had blue in them. If I recall correctly, there were quite a number of brides maids for the cake. We were so worried that we would drop the cake before it got into the van. She was so proud of that cake. It took a lot of work, research, preparation shopping, baking and tasting.

Your Mom was also a great bartender. Most of her drinks were made in tall water glasses and were 3/4 alcohol and 1/4 mixer. We would sit in the backyard and watch all of you in the pool. I don't know if we could ever rescue any of you in the pool if need be. I doubt we would be of any help, if any of the moms had more than one drink your Mother made on those hot summer days so long ago.

I also enjoyed our "Play Dates" as they are now called, in the summer afternoons when we sat on the front steps watching the gang play.

Your Mom was a wonderful person, very caring, and very giving.
