Bruce Rollier, age 97, of Tinton Falls, New Jersey, passed away on August 24, 2026.

Bruce was raised in a small town in Oklahoma. After serving in the Air Force as a navigator in two-person planes during the end of the Korean War, he went on to graduate from Oklahoma State University and Northwestern University, eventually getting his doctorate in information systems from NYU's business school. Bruce had a long career with IBM that took Bruce and Sharon from Minneapolis to Silver Spring, MD to Puerto Rico to New Jersey. Then Bruce went on to become a professor at the University of Baltimore, where he taught for sixteen years before spending his last twenty years in New Jersey.

In addition to being a devoted husband, loving father, and inspirational teacher, Bruce was passionate about the environment and loved to travel, proud that he and Sharon visited more than 40 countries and much of the U.S. He was an avid reader, and a generous person who frequently volunteered to help others.

Bruce is survived by Sharon, his loving wife of 63 years, as well as his children David and Suzanne, his sister Allene, and his grandsons Martin and Christian. He is preceded in death by his sister Jeanne and his brother

Dwayne.
